Anna: I know! Sometimes I just check SNS on my smart phone. So, how about you? What are you

Kenta: I am going to the park. Maybe I'll practice basketball with my friends. We are going to have a

game next week.

Anna: That sounds fun! Well, good luck with your studies.

Kenta: I'm looking forward to the next game!

Ai : I'm very hungry. Let's have lunch!

Riku : Yeah, I didn't eat breakfast, so I want to eat something. What can we do?

Yui : Well, we have three cafes around here. Let's check the menus on my phone.

Andrew : Sounds good! I don't know many places in this town, so I'll follow you.

Ai : OK, first is Pan Fan. It's only 300 meters from here. They have pancakes and drink.

Riku : How much is it?

Ai : Six dollars for the set.

Yui : Pancakes sound nice. I like sweet food for lunch sometimes.

Andrew: I like pancakes too, but I want something hot and salty. Pancakes aren't enough for me.

Riku : Let's look at Pizza Time then. It's 500 meters away. They have pizza and drink for seven dollars.

Ai : Pizza again? We had pizza last Friday, remember?

Yui : Yeah, and it was a little greasy...

Andrew: I've been to Pizza Time. Their pizza isn't bad, but the place is a little noisy. I like quiet cafes.

*Riku* : That's true. It's hard to talk there.

Ai : Wait, what's this? New NY Sandwich? I haven't seen this before.

Yui : Oh, that's new. It opened just last week.

Ai : The menu says they have sandwiches and drink. It's eight dollars. It's only 400 meters from here, so

it's not far.

Andrew: Oh! I know that cafe. We had it in New York too. I like it. Their sandwiches are really fresh.

Riku : Really? That sounds great. What kind of sandwiches?

Andrew: Chicken, egg, tomato... lots of choices. And their lemon tea is great. It's not so sweet.

*Yui* : That sounds better than pizza or pancakes.

Ai : Yeah, and it's new. I want to try it. It's a little more expensive, but it's worth it.

Riku : OK, then let's go to New NY Sandwich!

Yui: : Hmm··· it's a nice day today. Walking is fun.

Andrew: Yeah. And I'm glad I can show you something from New York.

Ai : Oh no... Look at the line! It's so long.

Riku : Unbelievable! Maybe we should go back to Pan Fan? It's near here, and cheaper too.

Yui : But we came all the way here, and I really want to try the sandwiches.

Andrew: I think so too. Let's wait and try them.

Ai : Right. I think it's OK to wait. Good food takes time!

Riku : Hmm... yeah, you're right. OK, let's wait. I want to try something new too.

Yui : Yay! Let's get in line!!

Andrew: Great! I like New NY Sandwich very much. I hope you will like it.

Do you remember things better when you write them by hand? Some students say yes, but others say no. These days, many students use computers or smartphones to take notes. But which way really helps your memory? Many teachers and students are interested in the question.

A group of teachers at a junior high school wanted to learn more about this. 200 students joined it. First, all of the students studied a list of 30 English words for 15 minutes. There were four groups of students.

- The first group wrote the words by hand.
- The second group read the words aloud.
- The third group typed the words on a computer.
- The last group just looked at the words on paper.

One hour later, all students took the same test to check their memory. The first graph shows the average test score for each group. Some students wrote the words by hand. These students got the highest scores. Writing by hand helped students remember more than reading aloud, typing, or just looking. Reading aloud also worked well. But just looking at the words helped the least. One teacher explained, "When students write by hand, they use their eyes, hands, and brains at the same time. That makes their memory stronger."

In another survey, the same school asked students about their favorite method. The result was a little different from the memory scores. This time, students did not only think about memory. They thought about comfort and speed, too.

Many students still liked writing by hand the most, but not everyone. Some students thought it was slow and made them tired. One second-year student said, "Typing is faster and easier, and I don't get tired." Another said, "Reading aloud helps me focus. I use my voice and ears, and that helps me stay awake." Some students liked just looking because it was easy, but many students did not remember well with that way.

So, what is the best way to study? It depends on your goal. If you just want to finish your homework quickly, typing may be good. But if you want to remember something for a long time, writing by hand is a better choice. It may take more time and energy, but it helps your brain remember more. Reading aloud can also help students when they enjoy speaking or listening.

These results are not only important for English. Many students say they can remember science facts or history dates better when they write them down. Some students even use a special notebook for difficult subjects. Other students make their own flashcards and write the same word many times. There are many ways to study, but the best methods use both your body and your brain. When you study for a test next time, you should think about your goal. Do you want to finish quickly, or do you want to remember it well? Try writing your notes by hand or reading aloud. You might be surprised by how much you remember!
